Summary

Claire was called to the Bar in 2013 by the Honourable Society of Lincoln's Inn. She studied LLB Law at Nottingham Trent University followed by a LLM, Masters in Criminal Justice with Human Rights Law, at Nottingham Law School. Claire completed her BPTC at Nottingham Law School where she received a very competent, with 'outstanding' grades in Family Litigation and advocacy.
